Classroom practice and school leadership in North Carolina will be improved through tailored, intensive professional development that includes follow-up, support, practice, feedback and evaluation. It is a collaborative effort that provides every student access to a competent, caring and highly qualified teacher. All fiscal and human resources within the educational community support classroom instruction and interactions that prepare students to thrive and contribute to a complex, dynamic global and multicultural society. Activities result in implementation of classroom practices that lead to improved student achievement.

- 3. Planning Time and Duty-Free Lunch In accordance with G.S. 115C-105.27(b)(6.) there is a plan in place to assure planning time during the regular student contact hours and duty-free lunch to the extent resources are available. Our school planning team has developed a lunch duty plan that has been shared and approved according to the School Improvement Plan approval process. In addition, a planning time schedule has been developed, shared and approved that details our progress in providing a minimum of five hours of planning time per week for every teacher.
- **4. Safe Schools Plan --** In accordance with G.S. 115C-105.47 our school has developed a safe school plan, which promotes a climate of respect and appropriate personal conduct for students and school personnel, and provides for safety, security and order. Student Learning Goals

- **Goal 1** The percentage of students failing courses will be lower than it was in the 2013-14 school year. (SLG 1)
- **Goal 2** We will reduce our drop-out rate and increase our 4-year cohort graduation rate. The number of students in each graduating class will be at least 85% of the number that entered the 9th grade four years earlier. (SLG 2)
- **Goal 3** The average composite scores of our students who take the SAT or ACT will be higher than the states' average composite scores. The percentage of students passing AP exams at JAH will be higher than the state's percentage. (SLG 3)
- Goal 4 JAHHS will meet expected growth in all EOC-tested subjects in 2014-15. (SLG 4)

Organizational Effectiveness Goals

- **Goal 1** We will improve the communication between faculty and administration, school and parents, and school and community. The percentage of positive responses to questions regarding communication on the community building survey will increase each year, or reach 95%. (OEG 1)
- Goal 2 We will increase parental and community involvement at JAHHS. The percentage of positive responses to questions regarding involvement on the community building survey will increase each year, or reach 95%. (OEG 2)
- Goal 3 We will improve the overall safety of students, faculty and staff at JAHHS. The percentage of faculty/staff, parents and students indicating on the school safety survey that they feel safe or very safe will increase each year. (OEG 3)
- **Goal 4** We will increase both daily and class attendance at JAHHS. (OEG 4)
- **Goal 5** We will increase the use of technology as a tool to help classroom instruction and organizational effectiveness. The percentage of positive responses in these areas on the STNA survey will increase each year. (OEG 5)

Student Learning Projects and Initiatives 2014-15

Projects:

- **1. Data Analysis** We will provide staff development and the opportunity for teachers and departments to analyze their instructional data in order to better guide instruction during weekly department meetings. We will investigate Open Class in Power School as a tool for data analysis. (SLG 1, SLG 4)
- **2. Responsiveness to Instruction (RtI):** We will implement elements of RtI throughout the school year. Weekly Team meetings will be held to proactively provide Tier II and III supports to identified students as well as RTI days where parent and teacher attendance will be encouraged. New referral forms will be used and Google tools will be used by the RTI Team to track the implementation and effectiveness of interventions (shared document that all JAHHS staff have access) used to provide support for students during the school year. (SLG 1, 2,and 4, OEG 1 and 4)
- **3. One to One Technology Program for Students:** We will provide an iPad 4 to all students at JAHHS with the goal of students keeping these devices over the summer. We will provide staff development on 21st century skills, Web 2.0 tools and pedagogy through the Friday Institute and Learning Team training. Teachers will practice and share these tools during weekly department meetings. (SLG 1,2,3, and 4, OEG 1 and 5)
- **4. ACT Preparation Classes:** We will provide an 18-hour ACT prep classes to all juniors during Ace Time prior to them taking the ACT in March 2015. (SLG 3)
- **5. STEM Curriculum** We will add a new STEM pathway in Engineering Design to increase STEM opportunities for our students. (SLG 2 and 3)
- **6. Summer Reading Lists:** We will investigate summer reading lists for students at all grade levels and determining ways to tie this into graduation project. (SLG 2)
- **7. Rigor -** We will increase and investigate rigor in all courses at JAHHS. This will include a lesson planning review and the creation of a lesson plan template for those interested in using it, the difference between quality and quantity, and investigating increased homework as students progress through high school. (SLG 1 and 4)
- **8. Staff Development** We will provide professional development on lesson planning, integrating technology into classroom practices, critical incidents and safety, RTI, PBIS, and understanding our students. (SLG 1 and 4) (OEG 3 and 5)
- **9. College of the Albemarle:** We will provide expanded opportunities for juniors and seniors to take college level courses for dual high school and college credit. (SLG 2)

Initiatives:

- **1. ACE TIME:** We will continue to revise ACE TIME to provide further opportunities for tutoring, lunch, enrichment activities including ACT preparation, improved attendance and APEX credit recovery. (SLG 1, 2, 3, and 4, OEG 4)
- **2.GEAR UP:** We will continue to participate in GEAR UP (Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs) to increase awareness and participation in college for our freshmen and graduating seniors. GEAR UP will operate a summer enrichment program for select students to improve skill and introduce them to the college experience. GEAR UP will also host an Orientation program for all rising 9th grade students during the summer of 2015. (SLG 3, OEG 1 and 2)
- **3.Summer School:** We will continue to modify our summer school program to increase access to students via on-line curricular providers and actual face-to-face instructions in all core areas. Students will be able to take online elective courses as well to accrue credits for graduation. (SLG 1 and 2)
- **4. Learning Management System:** In conjunction with the 1:1 Initiative we will continue use Canvas as the learning management system for use with student iPads. (SLG 1, 2, and 4)

Organizational Effectiveness Projects and Initiatives 2014-15

Projects:

- **1. Increase Parental involvement at Parent Conferences:** We will offer incentives such as dinner, babysitting, raffle giveaway etc. to encourage all parents to attend parent conferences. We will also investigate using Google Hangouts for parent conferences. (OEG 1 and 2)
- **2. Expanded Club Offerings/Service Projects:** All new staff members will be required to start a club or participate in an existing club. We will continue to require all clubs to complete a yearly service project at the school and in the community. (OEG 2)
- **3. Student Mentors:** We will investigate ways to provide student mentor for underclassmen including GEAR UP starting the Aces Ambassadors program. (OEG 4)
- **4.PBIS:** We will continue to implement PBIS at JAHHS intentionally teaching the behavior matrix to all students throughout the school year and also including more staff recognition and expanded student recognition with the goal of being named a PBIS Model School for 2014-15. We will incorporate a discipline matrix and consequence hierarchy to insure appropriate discipline actions for all students. (OEG 3)

- **5.Plant Facilities:** We will make improvements to CTE classrooms including renovating the Auto Shop into STEM classrooms, carpet and replace the ceiling in the Information Highway room, mulch the entire campus, beautify the school courtyard and garden area, restripe staff and student parking areas and complete adding nonskid tiles at all entrances. (OEG 2)
- **6. Power School/Home Base:** We will start using the Parent and Student Portal in Power School to increase access to student information for all interested parties. An informational session will be held for parents in the first semester. (OEG 1, 2, and 5)
- **7. Anonymous Issue Reporting:** We will investigate ways that students can report issues at school anonymously and without repercussions. (OEG 3)
- **8. Electronic Student Handbook:** Each student and parent will have access to the JAHHS Student Handbook electronically. Each will need to sign an acknowledgement form that they have read and understand the handbook. (OEG 3)

Initiatives:

- **1. Educators Handbook:** We will continue to use Educator's Handbook for increased student safety and to generate discipline letters for parents. A refresher staff training will be provided to all staff before the start of school. (OEG 1, 3, and 4)
- **2. Community Outreach:** The staff of JAHHS will work in conjunction with the Edenton Band Parents Association and the Edenton 300 committee to coordinate and run the Edenton Peanut Festival. JAHHS will also sponsor a Spring Fling community event at the school in the spring of 2015. Each department will have specific responsibilities for these community wide events. (OEG 1 and 2)
- **3. Communication:** We will continue to investigate and use expanded technology communication methods such as Facebook, Twitter, wikis, blogs, web-pages, and Canvas to both provide and receive information from our parents. (OEG 1 and 5)
- **4. Google Tools:** We will continue to use on-line tools including Gmail, Docs, Calendar and Drive to increase communication and efficiency at JAHHS. (OEG 1, 2, and 5)
- **5. Electronic Teacher Handbook:** We will update and revamp the electronic teacher handbook designed for ease of use by the staff. This will be stored as a shared Google Doc and will include a section for staff to access JAHHS forms. (OEG 1 and 5)

John A. Holmes High School "The Way We Do Business"

Programs and strategies that impact our Student Learning Goals:

- **1. Professional Development:** We provide professional development to staff in order to enable them to fully implement our initiatives and projects. Examples of staff development topics in 2014-15 include improved Lesson Planning, classroom integration of Web 2.0 tools, 1 to 1 implementation, and 21st century pedagogy.
- **2. Credit Recovery:** We offer credit recovery courses via Apex learning systems and the NCVPS.
- **3. Tutoring:** Teachers offer tutoring during school and by appointment before or after school to students who need extra help.
- **4. Inclusion:** We have an inclusion program for exceptional students including individualized instruction in Curriculum Assistance classes.
- **5. Units of Study:** We use units of study (pacing guides) to facilitate cohesive instruction.
- **6. Graduation Project:** All students participate in a graduation project based on service learning with a presentation in front of members of the community.
- **7. SAT and ACT Preparation:** We offer SAT and ACT prep courses on campus each semester and provide information on other free resources.
- **8. AIG:**Students are counseled to take AP, Early College, and Articulated Credit courses offered here and at the local campus of the College of the Albemarle.
- **9. Extra-Curricular Activities:** We offer numerous clubs and sports options to our students.
- **10. Guidance:** Students are provided with full guidance services, from course selections to college and career assistance, as well as teen counseling services.
- **11. RtI Team:** We have a JAHHS Intervention Team that meets weekly to discuss students about whom staff members have concerns. The team makes recommendations for interventions and services.
- **12. Learning Teams:** Teachers meet in Learning Teams for professional development, curriculum development, common planning, data analysis, and common assessment development.
- 13. Writing Across the Curriculum: Teachers will continue to assess their students' writing in every subject area including using North Carolina Final Exam constructive response questions where appropriate. Departments will set guidelines in order to insure consistent expectations.
- **14. Alternative Program:** We will continue to modify our alternative educational program to improve instructional services and opportunities so these students can continue to earn credits toward graduation.

Programs and strategies that impact our Organizational Effectiveness Goals:

- **1. Leadership Team:** Our Leadership Team serves as the decision-making body of our school. We include parents and students as members of our Leadership Team.
- **2. Athletics:** All athletes and their parent's meet with the Athletic Director and Coaches to discuss athletic policies and eligibility prior to the start of each athletic season.
- **3. Graduation:** All seniors and their parents meet with school administrators prior to graduation to discuss policies, procedures, and expectations. Monthly and quarterly newsletters are sent to parents of seniors.
- **4. Student Planners:** We use Canvas to help students with their organizational skills and classroom management. An electronic Student Handbook is included to help communicate with parents.
- **5. Communication:** We use a mass phone system, the school marquee, the school web site, email, conferences, social media and newsletters to communicate with parents and the community.
- **6. Surveys:** Annual surveys regarding safety and community building are given to the staff, students, and parents. We use this information to help identify areas for improvement.
- **7. Progress Reports:** Students receive multiple progress reports throughout each semester.
- **8. Meeting Schedule:** A schedule of faculty meetings, Leadership Team meetings, Learning Team meetings, RTI, PBIS, and AdvancEd committee meetings is distributed to staff members at the start of the school year.
- **9. Monthly Newsletters:** The Guidance Counselors publish newsletters each month for the parents of all students. These are also shared with all staff members.
- **10. Judicial Attendance Council:** We refer students with chronic attendance problems to the county's Judicial Attendance Council for intervention.
- **11. Orientation and Open House:** We hold a student and parent orientation program for freshmen at the beginning of the school year. We also hold an Open House prior to the start of each semester for parents and students.
- **12. Triple H:** A weekly communication from the desk of Mrs. Evans will be used to inform the staff of all school activities
